CAMP APPLICATION INFORMATION

How to qualify for CAMP?

Students may qualify for the CAMP program based on history of enrollment or current participation in the Migrant Education Program (MEP) anytime during K-12, **OR** the student or his/her parent(s) or legal guardian(s) must have worked in migrant or seasonal farm work for at least 75 days in the past 24 months **OR** eligible to participate or having participated in the National Farmworker Jobs Program (NFJP) Section 167 of the WIA. This farm work includes work performed for either wages or personal subsistence on a farm, ranch or similar establishments.

Migrant or seasonal farm work includes: any activity directly related to the production of crops, dairy products, poultry, or livestock; the cultivation or harvesting of trees including nursery and forestry work; or fish farm work.

Services provided by CAMP

- Academic skills assessment
- Tutoring and Mentoring
- Personal and Academic advising
- CAMP Summer Bridge program
- Financial Aid advising
- Term Stipend (End of each term)
- Book Allowance (Beginning of the term)
- Supplemental tuition aid to reduce loans

CAMP Scholar Internship Program (CSI)

CSI is a collaboration with University Housing & Dining Services. The program combines leadership training with hands-on and practical intern experience during the academic year. CSIs work in specific UHDS units. The internship consists of ten hours of work, including meetings and other active program experiences, which will provide an opportunity for the CSIs to develop and practice skills that help them succeed as students and community members of Oregon State University and meet the learning outcomes of the program.

The CSI program is an additional program associated with CAMP. The benefits include a partial room grant (estimated value between \$8,370 - \$9,810 dependent on chosen hall), individualized mentorship, leadership training, and professional development. To apply to this program, you will need to complete question five of the CAMP application as well as a sign the UHDS Terms and Agreement. - 3) Complete and submit the CAMP Application along with required forms and documentation
- 4) If interested in CSI, please respond to Essay Question 5 and fill out the UHDS Agreement of Terms and Conditions

CAMP Eligibility Checklist:

- Must be US permanent resident or US citizen
- Be a first-year incoming student and/or below 36 credits
- Enroll as full-time student at OSU (12 credits/quarter)
- Participated in the Migrant Education Program (MEP) **OR** from a Migrant/Seasonal farm working family **OR** participated in National Farmworker Jobs Program

I understand my commitment is for one academic year (September 2021 – June 2022) and that I will be required to attend mandatory CSI training orientation at the beginning of Fall term, all CSI weekly meetings held every **Monday from 4:00 – 6:00 pm during the academic year** and schedule a weekly meeting with the CSI Mentor.

I understand I will be required to maintain a 2.5, term and cumulative, grade point average throughout my participation in the CSI Program.

I understand as an OSU student I must follow all university policies and regulations, including but not limited to the UHDS Policy Guide and Student Conduct Code.

I understand the partial room scholarship is for a UHDS room of my choosing. The approximate value between \$9,075* and \$12,690* per academic year based on choice of residence hall. This does not include overhead fee, which will be on your own to cover, (see below) and is subject to change; reflects historically reasonable increase from 2020-2021 rates.

I understand that as an on-campus resident I will be required to purchase one of four (4) UHDS Dining Plans, between the costs of approximately \$2,550*-\$4,350* per year. Subject to change; reflects historically reasonable increase from 2020-2021 rates.

I understand that I will be responsible for the dining overhead cost of approximately \$2,100* per year. Subject to change; reflects historically reasonable increase from 2020-2021 rates.

I understand the CSI partial room scholarship is considered a part of the student's Financial Aid package by the US Department of Education. The Office of Financial Aid and Scholarship will adjust award packages accordingly prior to the beginning of fall term.
